Review Update

Friday 10th November was the last day of the review. We had the parent focus group in the morning followed by feedback from the panel and goal setting. Over the 3 review days, the Panel spoke to parents, teachers, education support staff and students. They attended planning and Professional Learning Community meetings (PLCs) and looked at performance data and trends.

The process was overwhelmingly positive, with the panel acknowledging the work achieved over the review period (2019-2023). Including

- . Inquiry 3-6 education research projects/Expos
- .Investigation increased visibility to curriculum
- . Parent/school partnership
- .Increased data collection, analysis and use (staff)
- . Introduced new mathematics instructional model
- . PLC
- .Student Voice & Agency

Feedback included the alignment between staff and school goals, the sense of community, and the inclusive and safe culture that was reported by all groups.

The Panel developed Goals, Key Improvement Strategies and Targets for the next School Strategic Plan (2023-2027). These will be shared with our community in the coming weeks.





This week we convened for our monthly School Council where we discussed a full and exciting agenda please see below the highlights I would like to share.
